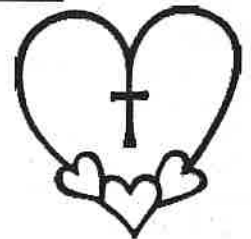

The February meeting of St John's United Church of Christ was called to order by Moderator Gayle Bauer via Zoom at 6:30 pm.

Introductions of new officers

Paul Meyer -Trustee and Todd Lien - Elder. Gordie Wiegrefe is returning for new three-year team as treasurer.

Reports

SPRC

Becky Tatge from SPRC shared that they recommended continuing the yoking agreement based on conversations with other members. The SPRC acknowledged the need for better communication and will be meeting monthly at this time. Confirmation is to continue as planned through the spring using a distance learning format. Pastor Lora's

last day at the Pulpit will be May 16th as she will use her remaining vacation time. The next SPRC meeting will be held February 22nd.

Trustee report

The pole in the parking lot that was damaged will be replaced at no cost to the church when weather permits. The roof should be finished within the next week or two.

Gayle Bauer reported that the membership list will be reviewed with the other elders and Pastor Lora prior to her departure. Plans will be made to attempt to contact the non-active members and update the membership list.

Race committee submitted a report for distribution of funds. Motion was made and passed to accept suggestions in report.

There will be no Wednesday in person services during Lent. There will be in person worship service for Maundy Thursday and Easter

Last Supper Drama- Committee has asked council approval to tape and post video of Last Supper Drama. Approval granted and the Sunday School was acknowledged for having a successful online program.

Installation of officers will be on Sunday February 14th. YouTube videos will remain online for a period of 3 months and then be taken down. Special events will be left up indefinitely.

Zoom license will expire on April 19th. This will be reevaluated later.

Council meetings will be held second Tuesday of the month.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:30pm with the Lord's Prayer.

World Day of Prayer March 5th at 1 p.m. Christ

Lutheran People can come and attend in person, watch it live streamed in real time, or see it later on YouTube. We are following all CDC protocols (masking, distancing, etc) for those who come to participate or attend. We will share a recipe card with Vanuatu dishes and view a video describing the country during our worship time. Now hundreds of thousands of people from all around the world gather to pray together on the first Friday of March. Each year a different country serves as the writers of the worship service. This year the service was written by the prayer committee of Vanuatu. Each of the 170 countries celebrating World Day of Prayer has an ecumenical committee responsible for determining the use of the offering which are focused on grants to women's and children's groups. Half of the offering collected here in Faribault will stay local.

March 14 (4th Sunday of Lent) is the date for a special offering. In UMC congregations on **UMCOR Sunday**, the offering directly affects the ability of the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) to respond immediately to disasters and other calamities. Because of gifts received through offerings like UMCOR Sunday

(formerly One Great Hour of Sharing), UMCOR is able to cover its administrative costs. When your church joins with other United Methodists to support UMCOR, you equip UMCOR staff to work globally to alleviate suffering and advance hope and healing. Through relationships with local organizations and trained community leaders, UMCOR can activate its network and provide emergency funds as soon as they know of an urgent need. MAC UMC Annual Conference 2021: June 22-24. The theme of our 167th Annual Conference is "Jesus. Waymaker." At this time, the hope is to have two virtual days and one in-person learning/teaching day in small groups around Minnesota. Registration will open in mid-April.



Minnesota UCC Conference Annual Meeting 2021: June 7-12 The theme is "Courageous Church" The Annual Meeting Planning Work Group, in

collaboration with Conference staff, is working hard to create an experience that will be educational, supportive, collaborative, and enjoyable — balanced by our sincere desire to keep everyone safe and healthy. To that end, the decision was made that the entire Annual Meeting will be virtual this year. Like the rest of the world, our team simply does not know when it will be safe to gather in-person, or even how that might look in June. That said, we have a lot of exciting plans to share with you!

The activities and learning sessions for the Annual Meeting will be spread out throughout the week of June 7, with the bulk of the work conducted on Friday and Saturday. Monday through Thursday we will have two workshop sessions each day, one mid-morning and the other mid-afternoon. We are accepting workshop proposals now! All workshops will be open to all delegates and visitors and will be recorded for later viewing by those registered for the Annual Meeting.

The business meeting, when we will vote on various business of the Conference (budget, compensation guidelines, etc.), will take place Friday afternoon and will be open to delegates only (to ease difficulties with online

voting) but will be recorded and available later for public viewing.

On Friday evening, June 11, we will formally kick-off the Annual Meeting with a worship service, Rev. Shari Prestemon's State of the Conference, and some fun surprises. Saturday will begin mid-morning with a keynote address from author Susan Beaumont, author of *How to Lead When You Don't Know What You Are Doing*. Virtual "tabletop conversations" will follow her keynote address. The afternoon of Saturday, June 12, we will reconvene for a virtual panel of congregational leaders across the state who have engaged in the vital task of racial justice work. Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson, Associate General Minister of the United Church of Christ, will moderate the panel, which will be followed by small conversation circles. Saturday will conclude with a virtual concert and social "chat" to visit with friend across the Conference.

On Sunday June 13, we will worship together across the state and hear a message from Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson. That virtual worship service will be live-streamed and we are working hard to make it as accessible as possible for every congregation in Minnesota to worship as one.

One important thing to note: there will be no resolutions this year. While resolutions are very important to the work of the Conference, the Board of Directors concluded that it added a level of complexity to a virtual meeting that will already be highly complex.

Finally, our registration costs. We will ask delegates to pay \$50 to attend the Annual Meeting, with delegates able to participate in all sessions. All visitors (non-voting delegates) will be asked to pay \$25 for all sessions except for those on Friday (open to voting delegates only). 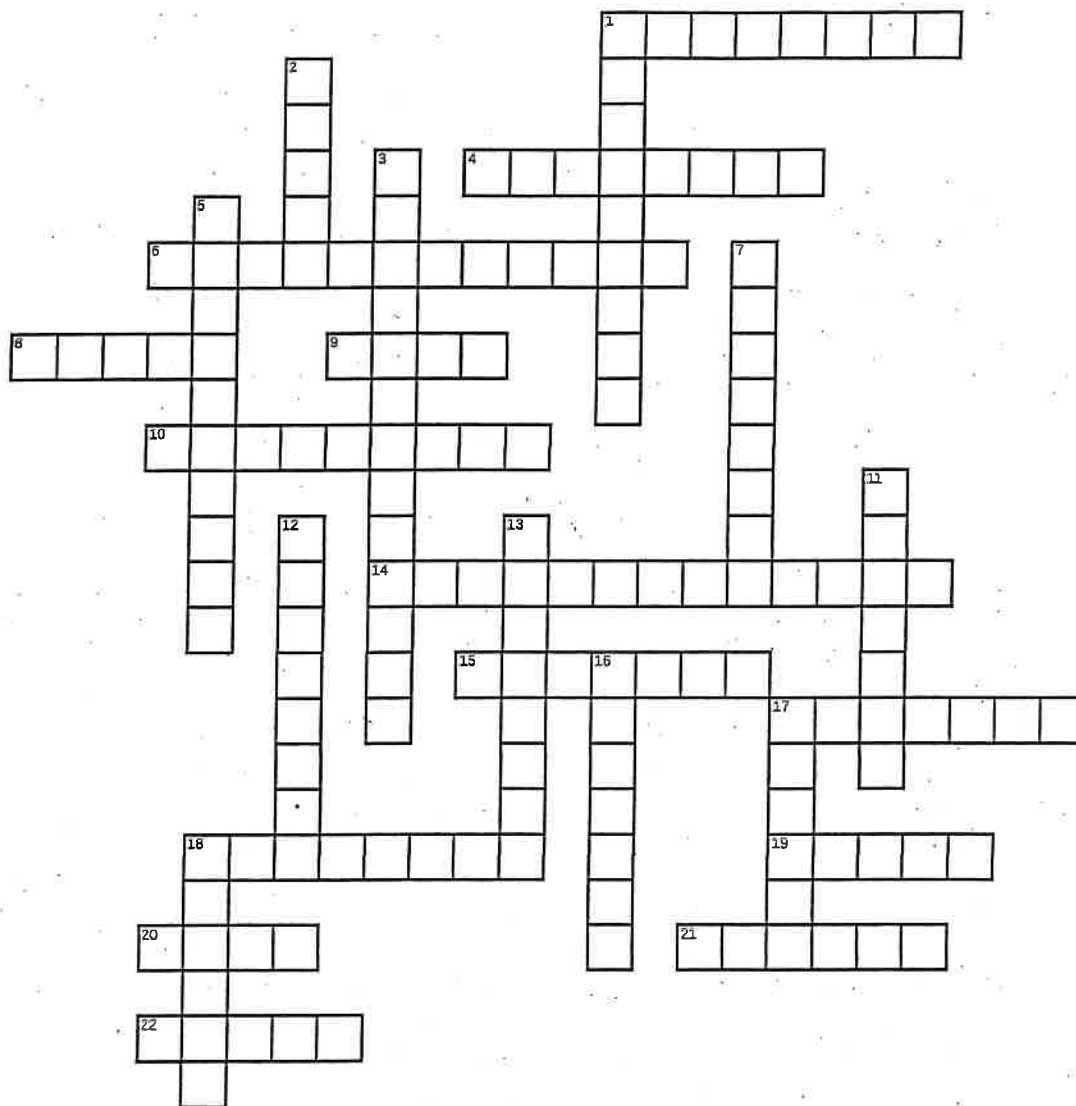

February 2021

Following the Minnesota Department of Health Guidelines (updated 2/2/2021) the following recommendations have been updated and will be implemented for in person worship at St. John's UCC.

Recommendations:

- If you are feeling sick, have recently been sick, or have been exposed to someone who has COVID-19, please stay home and worship online with us or another way available to you.
- Please return to in person worship when you feel comfortable. This will be a personal choice based on your own health needs or those around you.
- Face masks will be required per current state of MN mandates. If you are unable to keep a mask on for the entire service, please adhere to social distances guidelines and respect those around you. There will be a supply of masks available.
- Hand sanitizers will be available throughout the church.
- Physical distancing (6 feet apart) must be practiced at all times. This includes entering/exiting the church and sanctuary. Signs will be posted as reminders.
- One family unit per pew. Every other pew will be available.
- Singing is an option if you maintain a six feet distance from other family units and wear a face mask at all times.
- We ask that you try not to arrive more than ten minutes early to worship.
- A record of attendance will also be kept (For COVID-19 contact tracing purposes only. This record will be destroyed when no longer needed.)
- Bulletins will be available to pick up when you enter church.
- Offering plates will be set up at the exit of the sanctuary, and you can place your offering in the plate. Or the easiest and best method to give would be to give online!
- As you leave the church please remember to allow others to leave and not gather by the exits.
- While we are doing our best to offer a safe environment, congregants are attending voluntarily and the church cannot be responsible for any consequences of their attending.

In person worship recommendations will be changing based on the status of the pandemic and guideline changes from the MN Department of Health and the CDC.

Thank you for following these recommendations so that we can gather and worship together safely.

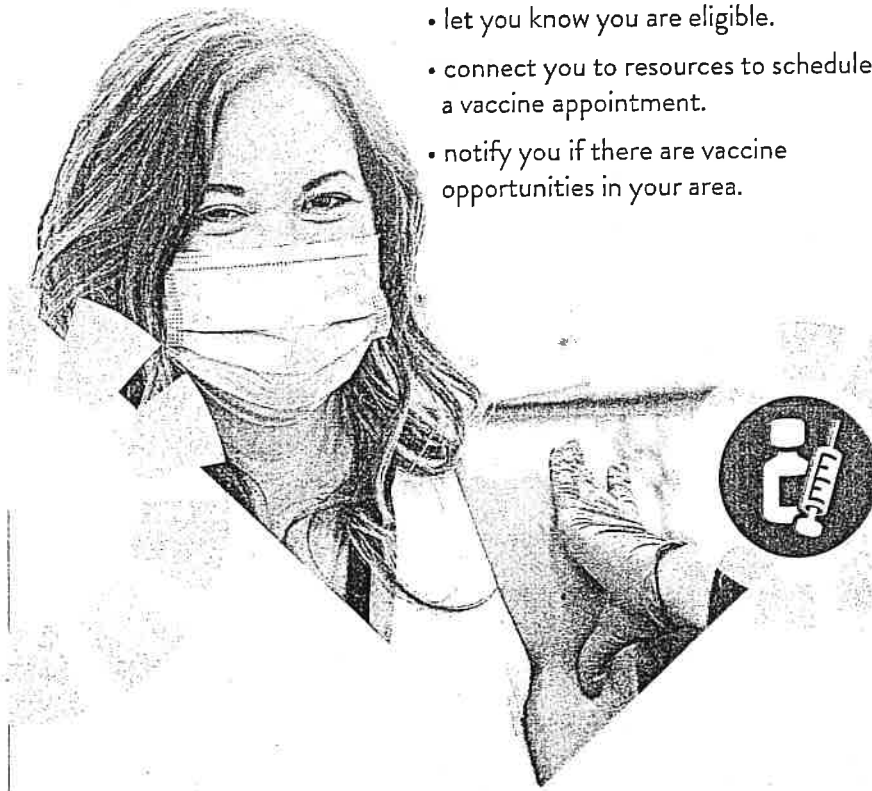
Minnesota's COVID-19 Vaccine Connector:

The Minnesota COVID-19 Vaccine Connector is a tool that helps you find out when, where, and how to get your COVID-19 vaccine.

Insurance and identification are not needed, and signing up is free.

When you become eligible to get the vaccine, the Vaccine Connector will:

- let you know you are eligible.
- connect you to resources to schedule a vaccine appointment.
- notify you if there are vaccine opportunities in your area.
